Various updates from the July 31 Chairman of the Board letter. This Letter is available on the Al-Anon.org web site.

The financial statements ending June 30, 2019 show

- Literature sales are higher than expected. *Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships* (B-33) and the *Just for Tonight* Bookmark are big sellers. For that matter, sales of Conference Approved Literature are meeting or exceeding expectations.
- Contributions are down. The WSO received a bequest in May, which helped put the budget on track, but without it, we would be behind. The last quarterly appeal letter will coming soon. Please give serious consideration to

have your group give the WSO \$25 more than they did last year.

- Remember, you can continue to give in Lois' honor, or if you would like to remember someone else in the program that has passed on.

Policy Update

- The Policy Committee voted to form a Thought Force to further consider if the policy on Al-Anon members who are also members of A.A. participating in Al-Anon service applies to prior members of A.A., and how or if former members of A.A. might be defined and by whom.” **This doesn’t mean there will be any changes to our current Policy; it means there will be further discussion on the topic.**

WSO receives requests to review public outreach materials on an ongoing basis. Lately, many of the posters and flyers submitted are including the words “drug” and “drug addiction” in addition to “alcohol” and “alcoholism.” The 2018 Membership Survey did state 35% of members came to our program specifically because of someone’s use of drugs. Yet, the survey also showed 78% of these members eventually came to realize that someone else’s drinking had also affected their lives.

Vali F, WSO Executive Director, recently sent a letter noting, while the efforts to include “drug” and “drug addiction” are well-intentioned, members are urged to keep Al-Anon’s Twelve Traditions in mind when communicating with the public. We are all messengers of Al-Anon’s purpose and have the responsibility to accurately communicate it to avoid confusion, misperception, or dilution of our program. The Traditions to reference are Tradition Three, Four, Five, and Ten. Please review the words of the Traditions in their entirety.

Also reference the statement on page 131 in Al-Anon’s Conference-approved “Digest

I have been greatly honored to serve as your Literature Coordinator over the past 3 years. With each new Al-Anon position, comes new growth. Just when you think, "Hey, maybe I got this!" it is time to move on. Thank you for the privilege to serve Iowa Al-Anon.

Here are some updates from WSO: *New Daily Reader* (working title) – The WSO is in the process of hiring a professional freelance writer/editor who is an Al-Anon member to analyze all sharings received and submit drafts of daily readings to the Literature Committee for review. Once these have been evaluated, we will notify the fellowship of any topics for which additional writings are needed.

Alateen Newcomer Packet (K-18) – To reduce rising costs and efficiently allocate resources, this newcomer kit, like the *Al-Anon Newcomer Packet* (K-10) before it, has been converted into a booklet. The new booklet offers a more aesthetically

pleasing product and provides better ease of use. The price has increased from \$1.40 to \$1.75

2020 CAL Catalog (S-15) – The English version of this free service tool is now available and can make great handouts at Assemblies to remind everyone of the wide variety of material available. It was included as an insert in the September issue of *The Forum* and is also available as a free download at al-anon.org/cal-catalog.

Intimacy in Alcoholic Relationships (B-32) is now over a year old. This has been the sixth largest seller. However, often times in the second year sales will drop off. Please continue to encourage members to use the book.

Please consider sharing your story with WSO. They continue to need sharings for "CAL Corner," *The Forum*, and the *New Daily Reader*. For the *New Daily Reader* sharings are particularly needed on the Steps, Traditions and Concepts of Service, as well as ones that exemplify the wide variety of relationships and backgrounds of members today.
