Our Area began dreaming big at our TEAM event in 2016 with a workshop on abundance. This theme was reiterated several times at our Area Assemblies throughout the last term. The Spiritual Principles of Al-Anon's Self Support (found in version two of our Service Manual on page 102) – Abundance, Anonymity, Gratitude, Responsibility, Trust and Unity – were reflected in the productivity and unity at our January AWSC meeting. ALATEEN COORDINATOR

What a great Area Service Workshop and Area World Service Committee meeting (AWSC) we had in January! As always, the skits and workshops were 'spot on'. District 8 did a Conflict Resolution workshop that can be used by Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS) as personalities can sometimes get in the way of helping our teens. Then Sunday, at the AWSC, Virginia held a workshop where the DRs were shown what is needed to be filled out on the forms to become an AMIAS and explained that all forms are sent to me as Alateen Coordinator/AAPP. I then send the Criminal History Record Check to the Area Chairperson, Virginia.

The Alateen Serenity Weekend is April 17-19. This year the Alateens will have Otterbein and Wesley Inn for sleeping accommodations. Each teen will receive an IOWA SERENITY WEEKEND T-shirt -- with tie dying a possibility. As our numbers were down last year, we are sharing the camp with a quilting group who will be in Timber Lodge. I checked out the menu and it is similar to last year. Let's increase our numbers. What can we do to give our eligible teens the gift of recovery afforded by the Alateen Serenity Weekend?

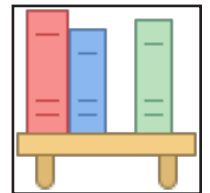
