# Coordinator Reports:

<u>Alateen:</u> Alateen has some exciting news. West Des Moines has a new Alateen group that will be starting up July 12, Alateen Friday Night Step Study. This group will be meeting at the St. Mark's Lutheran Church on Friday nights at 7:00. I know Deb M. has been working very hard to get another group started in the Des Moines area. Thank you to all who have worked to provide another venue for our teens. I've heard from one district asking for ideas on outreach and all groups seem to be either holding their own or picking up some new members.

Our Alateen speaker for the June Assembly in Sioux Center is Jayden M. from Humboldt. Jayden attends the newly formed group Fort Dodge Alateen. She seems to be excited to have been invited to be the Alateen speaker. Jayden attended our Alateen Serenity Weekend in April.

There was a little confusion as to who has authority to permit an AMIAS take an Alateen to an event outside of the state. The Policy & Procedure manual states all AMIAS are required to have the Area's approval prior to taking Alateens to events with Alateen participation within or outside of the Area. The confusion is as to who the "Area" is. Who has the authority to give permission to attend. The Alateen team will be meeting to help clarify this in the Iowa Policy & Procedure Guidelines manual for future requests.

<u>Archives</u>: I wish I could have been at the Assembly in Sioux Center today. I will miss the social interaction with each of you. But I am grateful for Hybrid meetings and giving me the opportunity to attend. I have purchased the new tubs to store the Archives in. They are clear blue tubs, so you can see contents easily and they are waterproof. They also have a handle and wheels for easy transport. Currently we have six.

I attended an Archives Coordinator Webex call in March. We were given an update from the Associate Director-Community Relations, had a round robin discussion on key questions. The last session was on AFG Connects and using it as your resource library and to share experiences, strength and hope/best practices. I look forward to attending the next meeting on Sunday June 23<sup>rd</sup>.

There are some items in the Archives that I would like to have identified as to where did it come from and what is its significance to Iowa Al-Anon. I will be bringing the items to the next AWSC meeting to hopefully be identified.

<u>Group Records</u>: Things are going really good here in the world of Group Records! Earlier this Spring, I was able to watch a WSO webinar on Group Records. Currently, WSO is working on combining the data bases for the face-to-face meetings, and the electronic meeting, which at present, are housed on two separate databases. This is a HUGE job, and it will take them some time to get this completed. Because of the enormity of this project, it is very helpful to WSO, and to me, if you email me directly with any changes that need to be made to your Group Records. Sending your changes directly to me frees WSO up to focus on this major project they are working on, and in some cases, I can get the changes made for you a little quicker. I really appreciate your help with this!

<u>Literature:</u> Al-Anon literature has the unique ability to speak directly to our stories. Your story is written through every book when you look for the commonality instead of the differences. You could be part of a new Al-Anon publication! Several years ago, the Literature Committee began discussing requests from the fellowship for a piece of Conference Approved Literature on sponsorship and service sponsorship primarily comprised of member sharings.

The 2023 World Service Conference gave conceptual approval "to develop a comprehensive piece on sponsorship and service sponsorship using personal stories from Al-Anon members." Since then, a

writing guideline has been developed, approved, and translated into French and Spanish and is now available for distribution throughout the fellowship. I will have copies of the guidelines at the Literature Workshop on Sunday morning, or you can find them at the "Send Your Sharing" page of the Al-Anon website. New CAL coming this fall!

In 2021, the WSC gave conceptual approval to add a new introduction to The Dilemma of the Alcoholic Marriage (B-4) that places the book in a historical perspective and to develop a booklet of gems from this book, possibly including some new material. That booklet has evolved into Healing within Our Alcoholic Relationships – A Collection of Insights from Our Share Journey (P-95). It is currently in the design and translate stage and will be available this fall!

• Identify information about the Area and our links of service that Districts might find beneficial in helping them understand the value of connecting with the Area. Suggest ways to share this information.

• Provide ideas for opportunities to connect with unrepresented districts that can be used to foster growth and increase awareness of the benefits of staying connected at all service levels.

Our Task Force consists of the following: Area Chair, Past Delegate, Alateen Coordinator/AAPP, Public Outreach Coordinator, and Group Records Coordinator. We met March 27, April 7, April 14, May 5 and June 2, 2024. District 15, where our June Assembly is being held, does not have an Al-Anon meeting. Hosting from afar has proved challenging, but not insurmountable, thanks to District 2. We appreciate their help.

The Task Force has brought Al-Anon and Alateen Public Outreach information to the Assembly in hopes that it might be shared with the family members of our AA friends who are hosting the Assembly.
